



## Finding out more careers linked to subjects

Please find below some activities that you can do using the [Careerpilot](https://www.careerpilot.org.uk/) website to find out about different subjects and how they can lead a range of interesting careers:

- Ask members of your family or friends about the subjects they liked the most at school & why
